Pedagogical Skills

Identifying Students' Needs for Effective Research and Learning

- Added human subject training for MAIS students since majority of students use human subjects for their research. Such training is necessary to guide students to conduct ethical and professional research.
- Made changes to MAIS 503: Ethnographic Research by adding statistical analyses. These changes made students review the statistics learnt during the summer, and prepare them for statistical analysis for their theses. Because such changes, students significantly increased students' thesis completion rate.
- Made changes to MAIS 504: Statistical Analysis by requiring students to compose a thesis draft. Such a thesis draft lifts up students' confidence to revise and complete the thesis. More students (about 90%) finished their theses in 2013.
- Developed flexible deadlines for those students who arrived in China late.

Providing Effective Advising and Mentoring

- Initiated summer thesis topic advising for most students to help them to develop clear and researchable topic by volunteering my summer time. Most students felt confident that they could conduct their research.
- Caring advisees and encouraging them to complete their theses.
- Spending tremendous amount of time providing feedback to all advisees. One student's thesis was revised 12 times, and I helped sentence by sentence, paragraph by paragraph, and section by section. She finally completed the thesis.
- My advisees' graduation rate is about 100% (except one without any responses).
- Skyping with some students with learning difficulties.
- Integrated Christian love into advising and communicating with students. In Fall 2014, a student had conflicts with an IRB reviewer, I used about two dozens of emails to help the student to solve the conflict with Christian love.

- Appointments are open to students at all time slots. Since my students in China, I have to provide them suitable time either at my weekend or at night.
