BSW (Bachelor of Social Work) is a practice degree that allows you to **immediately** enter the field as a **professional social worker**.

The BSW program centers around **experiential learning**. Most courses include a **service-learning** component where students use their education to benefit the community.





Social work majors complete a 400-hour **field internship** for the development of practice skills that often results in **employment**.

BSW students complete an **applied research project** connected to their senior year internship and have the opportunity to submit their work for **publication**.





Faith integration in the BSW program seeks to understand the role of **spirituality** and **faith** as part of a **holistic approach** to social work practice.
